The "Villa of the Antonines" is a probable imperial villa located in the territory of ancient Lanuvium on the slopes of the Alban Hills near the 18th milestone of the Via Appia just outside of Rome. Although the villa's bath complex has received some study previously, the new Montclair State excavations have begun to bring to light additional remains that include a large curving structure (possible amphitheater) and evidence for the lavish use of decorative marbles from all around the Mediterranean. In this talk the directors of the project will discuss their work during the summer 2010 season and will outline the main archaeological and historical problems that they are confronting in studying this site.
