Recommended Plan (Fall 2006)

The recommended plan is designed to provide a blueprint for students. These plans are recommended sequences of courses. Students should meet with their MAT Advisor to develop a more individualized plan to complete their degree. This plan is based on the premise that the required Linguistics courses will be taken at the undergraduate level, which is all that New Jersey requires for certification. Undergraduate linguistics courses begin with the prefix LNGN. Graduate courses, which begin with the prefix APLN, may be substituted for any of the required courses. However, the graduate courses follow a two year rotation and may not always be available when needed, while the undergraduate courses are taught every year.
